ALL SEASONS WATER USERS DISTRICT

Water Operator/Maintenance Responsibilities

The individual in this position will do work activities association with the operation, maintenance, and repair of the All Seasons Water Users District rural water pipeline. ASWUD is a political subdivision led by a 9 member Board of Directors.

This main office for this position is in Bottineau. Individual will be required to travel throughout the 7 counties included in the system.

General Duties:

- 1. Operate and maintain water distribution system (including servicing of pumps, motors, valves, etc.) for proper operation.
- 2. Clean out and maintain system reservoirs as scheduled. Backwash 3 treatment plants.
- 3. Assist as necessary to maintain electrical system and telemetry system.
- 4. Maintain all buildings and sites throughout the system. System includes: 3 treatment plants, 7 reservoirs, 4 well houses, 4 master meter stations, 1 above ground storage tank, and office/shop. Such duties shall include mowing, snow removal, cleaning, painting, piping, pump replacement and other associated tasks.
- 5. Operate and maintain Willow City water and sewer systems.
- 6. Build and maintain fencing as required for pump stations, reservoir sites etc.
- 7. Provide office with meter reading spot checks as deemed necessary and meter readings annually.
- 8. Perform rural water hookups for rural customers and install new water lines.
- 9. Repair leaks and cleanup site.
- 10. Service calls for customers.
- 11. Take water samples and deliver to health department for mandated testing.
- 12. Locate pipelines when necessary for contractors and landowners.
- 13. Obtain and provide assistance to co-workers.
- 14. Promote positive relationships with co-workers, customers, and landowners.
- 15. Must be available for and willing to work after hours and weekends on call.
- 16. Maintain required records in applicable written or computer format.
- 17. Must become familiar with troubleshooting typical problems found in water distribution systems.
- 18. Must become familiar with safety guidelines and utilize same in workplace.
- 19. Must be willing to attend training courses.
- 20. Must become certified to operate system.
- 21. Perform other activities as might be required or requested.

Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities:

- 1. Ability to maintain effective working relationships with a diversified group of people under trying and stressful conditions.
- Ability to communicate courteously and professionally to reflect a positive image of ASWUD to its customers and the public.
- 3. Ability to access and interact through in-house and remote locations with computer control systems.
- 4. Ability to work independently and efficiently.
- 5. Ability to adjust work schedule to necessary duties.
- 6. Ability to handle confidential matters.
- 7. Ability to analyze, interpret, and recommend sound solutions to problems of routine nature.

Typical Physical/Environmental Demands:

- 1. Requires extended periods driving a vehicle. Occasionally must lift up to 75 pounds.
- 2. Requires finger dexterity, hearing, vision, and the ability to do close work.
- 3. On a daily basis, requires the ability to read, write, compile, and analyze data and reports.
- 4. On a daily basis, requires the ability to work courteously and firmly with others.
- 5. Must enter confined space areas such as manholes, vaults, and reservoirs.
- 6. Must climb towers and reservoirs as necessary.

Supervision:

The Operator is under the immediate supervision of the manager. The Operator is responsible for carrying out day-to-day duties independently and only consults supervisor on unusually complex problems or precedent setting actions.

Education and Experience:

- 1. High school diploma or equivalent.
- 2. Must have a water distribution and water treatment certification as a Grade 02 operator.
- 3. Electrical and/or electronic experience beneficial, but not mandatory.
